Hotel Type: Boutique

I recently stayed at the Chelsea House in Key West. I had a good size room that featured a king bed, chair, bureau, nightstands and extensive walking space. The room was located on the second floor and there was no elevator but my bags were carried up the stairs for me. There was also a large wrap around porch off of my room to share with two other rooms. The wall air conditioner kept the room very cool and created the white noise that I appreciate for sleeping. My room was located at the back of the house where things were quiet. Other guests mentioned experiencing noise from people on the streets through the night. A free breakfast is offered around the pool and it included cereal, oranges, bananas, hard boiled eggs, yogurt, some bakery items and coffee and tea.

Number of rooms: 48, most with one bed.
